ACT 1

A long time ago, Lear was King of Britain. He had three daughters. The oldest daughter, Goneril, was married to the Duke of Albany. His middle daughter, Regan, was the wife of 5 the Duke of Cornwall. The King of France and the Duke of Burgundy both wanted to marry

his youngest daughter, Cordelia.

King Lear was old and tired, and he decided to give the country to his three daughters. 10 They and their husbands would rule instead of him, while he, with one hundred knights to protect him, would stay with each daughter in turn for a month. In order to decide how to share the country between his daughters he 15 asked them to say how much they loved him.

Goneril, the oldest, said that she loved her father very much. She made a long list of things of great value and said that she loved her father more than any of them and as much 20 as life itself. The King was very pleased with her answer, and he gave her and her husband one third of the land. Regan said that she loved her father even more than her sister did. The King was very pleased again, and he gave 25 her and her husband another third of the land.

Cordelia, King Lear's youngest daughter, was his favourite. He was sure that Cordelia would say that she loved him even more than the other two. But Cordelia did not want to 30 compete with her sisters in boasting(1) about her love for her father. She knew that they did not love their father as much as they said. When her turn came, she said, 'I love you as

much as a daughter should love her father, no 35 more and no less.' Lear was shocked.(2) He told her to think again, and give him a better answer. Cordelia said that it was right for a child to return the love its parent had given it.

King Lear was even more shocked and got very angry. He said that Cordelia was no longer his daughter, and gave her share of the country to Goneril and Regan. It was now the turn of everyone else to be shocked. The King's advisers all thought that he was wrong but the Earl of Kent was the only one who was brave enough to say anything. He reminded the King that Cordelia was his favourite daughter and that she loved him very much. He asked the King to think again, and to act more sensibly. 50 But the King just got even angrier, and he sent Kent away. Lear then asked the King of France and the Duke of Burgundy if they still wanted to marry Cordelia, now that she had nothing apart from the clothes she was wearing. 55 Burgundy said no; but the King of France loved her for telling the truth and did not care about land or money. Cordelia said goodbye to her sisters, asking them to look after their father well, and then she left with the King of 60 France. Her sisters warned each other that Lear's cruel treatment of Cordelia meant that there was something wrong with his mind and that in future he might also turn against them.

Meanwhile, the Earl of Gloucester's 65 illegitimate son Edmund was planning to take his legitimate brother's place. He showed his



by Edgar. The letter asked him to help Edgar kill their father for a share of everything the 70 old man had. Gloucester believed this. Edmund then told Edgar that their father was very angry with him and advised him to hide 85 from the old man.

After Lear and his hundred knights(3) had 75 stayed with Goneril for two weeks, things started to go wrong. Goneril told her servants to be rude and to quarrel(4) with Lear's men. 90 Although Lear had sent him away, the Earl of Kent returned. He disguised(5) himself as a

father a letter which he said had been written 80, poor man, and he became Lear's servant. He hit Goneril's servant Oswald for speaking disrespectfully to Lear, and then Lear's Fool joked that Lear himself had become the Fool because he had given away all his power to his daughters. Goneril was unkind to Lear about the behaviour of his men. And now Lear cursed⁽⁶⁾ Goneril, wishing that if she had a child, that it would torment⁽⁷⁾ her.

Lear was even more angry when he found that Goneril had tried to dismiss fifty of his men. He was so upset by Goneril's behaviour that he was afraid he would go mad.

ACT 2

Edmund told his brother Edgar to run away because someone had told their father where 35 he was hiding, and that he would be killed. Edgar believed this and ran. He planned to 5 hide from his father's men by pretending to be a mad, homeless person. Meanwhile, Edmund cut his arm with his sword. (1) Then he told his father that Edgar had done this because he, Edmund, had refused(2) to help Edgar kill the 10 old man. Gloucester was very angry, but also very sad: 'O madam, my old heart is cracked, it's cracked!' he told Regan. Regan blamed(3) Edgar's (apparent) evil⁽⁴⁾ plan to kill his own father on the terrible influence(5) of Lear and 15 his knights.

Lear asked Kent to take a letter to his daughter Regan. The letter told Regan to get 50 ready because he was coming to stay at her house with all his knights. But Goneril also 20 sent a letter to Regan. She complained about their father and warned her sister that his men

were noisy and expensive.

The two messengers⁽⁶⁾ arrived at the same time, and they argued with each other. Kent 25 hit Goneril's messenger Oswald and he fell to the ground. Regan and her husband the Duke of Cornwall ordered their men to make Kent a prisoner, even though it was extremely disrespectful to do this to the King's messenger. 30 When the King arrived, the first thing he saw was his servant Kent as a prisoner. He could not believe that anyone would dare (7) to do this to his messenger. He demanded to see his

daughter and her husband, but he was told they were too tired to see him. Then he saw that Goneril was already there. She had come to tell her sister not to look after Lear.

Regan later told the King to go home with Goneril. She told him to send away fifty of his men and ask Goneril to forgive him for being angry and thinking too much of himself.

The King reminded Regan that he had given her half of all his land, and asked her to let him stay, with all his men. Regan said that even 45 fifty men were too many. She would accept only twenty-five. So Lear said that he would go back with Goneril. He said that she must love him twice as much as Regan because she would allow him fifty knights instead of twenty-five. Then the sisters said that really he didn't need ten, or five, or even one of his own men.

The King now realised that giving away everything had been a terrible mistake. He 55 had lost all his power, and his two older daughters felt no love or kindness for him. It was night time and a terrible storm was just beginning. Goneril and Regan offered shelter® to Lear, but not to any of his men. He felt he could not stay with either daughter, so he went out into the storm, alone except for Kent and his old Fool.

The old Earl of Gloucester felt sorry for Lear, but Goneril and Regan only said that if their 65 father was suffering, he himself was the one to blame.

come to England with an army, and with Cordelia. Kent sent Cordelia a letter to explain what had happened. Then he went looking for 5 Lear. Meanwhile, Lear's sorrow and anger had become too great for him to bear(1) and he went mad. He shouted at the storm to do its worst: 'Blow winds and crack your cheeks!'

Kent persuaded Lear to take shelter in a 10 small, dirty hut. (2) For the first time, Lear began to feel sorry for people other than himself as he 45 King of France. thought about those who had no homes and only old, thin clothes to wear. Inside the hut they found Edgar, who was disguised as a 15 beggar⁽³⁾ called 'poor Tom'. He was pretending to be mad, and he had no clothes, covering himself just with a blanket. (4) Lear was sure that poor Tom had gone mad because he had given everything to his daughters - just like himself.

Meanwhile, Gloucester told Edmund that Albany and Cornwall were quarrelling with each other, and that he had received a letter which told him about the King of France's plan to rescue Lear from his cruel daughters. 25 Gloucester felt upset because Regan and Cornwall had stopped him from helping Lear or even talking about him. He had now decided to take Lear's side against Goneril, Regan and their husbands.

Hearing this, Edmund decided to repeat everything to Cornwall, even though he knew that his father would be in serious trouble.

Gloucester now refused to follow the Duke of Cornwall's orders and, instead, went out looking

Kent found out that the King of France had 35 for Lear. He found him in the hut and asked him to come back to his castle, but Lear refused to leave 'poor Tom'. Then, in his madness, Lear held a mock trial⁽⁵⁾ of his evil daughters, with the Fool, 'poor Tom' and Kent as judges(6) and 40 stools in the place of his daughters.

Later, Gloucester heard Regan and Cornwall as they planned to kill Lear, so he warned Kent to take the King to Dover,(8) where he would be safe with Cordelia and the

Cornwall was very angry when Edmund told him what Gloucester had done. He called Gloucester a traitor, (9) and told Edmund that he would punish the old Earl. Edmund decided 50 to leave, so that no-one could blame him for not protecting his father.

Cornwall decided to punish Gloucester by blinding him. He ordered his servants to tie the old man to a chair. Then he blinded one of 55 Gloucester's eyes. Just as he was going to blind the other eye too, one of his servants suddenly attacked(10) him: he could not bear the Duke's cruelty any longer. The Duke of Cornwall killed the man, but he himself was also hurt. 60 Despite this, he went on to blind Gloucester's other eye, and then told his suffering victim(11) that it was his own son Edmund who had betrayed(12) him. Gloucester then realised that Edmund had lied to him from the beginning, 65 and that Edgar was innocent.(13)

At that point, Regan ordered the blind old man to be thrown out of his own castle into the

Edgar and Gloucester, who was now blind, met out on the windy heath. Edgar took care of his father but did not say who he was. He still pretended to be 'poor mad Tom'. Gloucester remembered seeing Tom the night before with Lear. He reminded me of my poor son Edgar,' said the old man. How I wish I could hold him in my arms again, though I will never be able to see him now! We are like flies and the 10 gods are like cruel little boys; they torment and kill us for fun. While Gloucester was talking like this, Edgar could hardly speak because of his sorrow at seeing his poor father blinded.

15 Gloucester now asked Edgar to take him to
Dover. He wanted to throw himself from the
high cliffs⁽⁵⁾ there and end his unhappy life.
Edgar agreed, but instead took him to the
middle of a field. Gloucester jumped, but of
20 course he only fell to the ground. Edgar lifted
him up, pretending to be a friendly stranger. (4)
He allowed his father to think that he had
fallen and survived by a miracle. (5)

Meanwhile, Goneril had fallen in love with 25 Edmund. She now despised⁽⁶⁾ her own husband the Duke of Albany as a weak person. On the other hand, Albany had come to hate what Goneril, Regan, Cornwall and Edmund

Edgar and Gloucester, who was now blind, met out on the windy heath. Edgar took care of his fether but did not say who he was. He

Then a messenger brought the news that the Duke of Cornwall had died after the servant's attack during the blinding of Gloucester.

35 Goneril was immediately worried by this news. It meant that her sister Regan was now a widow⁽⁸⁾ and might marry the man she now wanted for herself – Edmund. Albany's mind was on something very different. He now understood that Edmund had betrayed his own father to Cornwall's cruelty, and he was very angry. He decided to punish Edmund for being such a terrible traitor.

At this point, the King of France had to return to France, leaving Cordelia near Dover with his army. There, she read Kent's letter telling her about Lear's fall into madness. Lear was now in Dover, but he felt too ashamed⁽⁹⁾ of the way he had behaved towards Cordelia to see her. Gloucester and Edgar met Lear, covered in wild flowers and out of his mind. Gloucester recognised⁽¹⁰⁾ Lear's voice, as the old King explained that the poor and powerless are always the ones who are punished for their crimes,⁽¹¹⁾ while the rich and powerful do the same things but are not punished. Then Lear



recognised Gloucester – the first sign that his madness was beginning to disappear.

Meanwhile, Goneril's servant Oswald had been ordered to find Gloucester and kill him. But Edgar, still in disguise, prevented this. They fought and he killed Oswald. Then he carrying from Goneril to Edmund. In the letter Goneril told Edmund to kill her husband Albany so that he could marry her.

Now Cordelia found Lear. She was very sad

to see him mad. Her doctor gave him medicine 70 to make him well again. When he woke up he was confused, (12) and did not know where he was. Cordelia knelt(13) down in front of him and asked for his blessing.(14) As for Lear, he realised that this was Cordelia, and he fully found and read a letter that Oswald was 75 expected her to be angry with him. After all, she had every reason to be! But Cordelia made him understand that she loved him and forgave him. Both father and daughter were extremely happy to be together again.

ACT 5

When Regan asked Edmund if he was in love with Goneril, he denied(1) it. But just then Goneril and Albany arrived, and the sisters were immediately jealous⁽²⁾ of each other. Each 5 knew that the other wanted to marry Edmund, and each wanted to make sure that she herself would win him. As for Edmund, he could not make up his mind which sister to marry.

Meanwhile, Edgar, who was still disguised, 10 gave a letter to Albany. It was the one that 50 Goneril had written to Edmund. So with this, Albany knew that his own wife had planned

to kill him and marry his killer.

Now it was time for the great battle(3) 15 between the French and English armies. Edgar 55 while getting ready for the battle, he had hid his father for safety under a tree while the battle was being fought. The battle began, and the English army under Edmund won. Unfortunately for Lear and Cordelia, they 20 were both captured.(4)

Lear was not afraid of going to prison if he could just be sure of staying with Cordelia. He tried to make her feel happier by saying: 'Come, let's away to prison: We two will sing like birds

25 in the cage.' (5) But after they had been taken to prison, Edmund gave one of his soldiers a letter with secret orders to kill them.

Albany understood the danger to Lear and Cordelia, and he asked Edmund to let him 30 look after the two of them. Edmund said he 70 would let Albany have them, but not now. He would give them to him the next day, he said. Albany reminded Edmund that he should not talk like this to him, as the young man was not 35 his social equal.

Then Goneril and Regan began to quarrel about Edmund - until Regan suddenly became very ill and collapsed. Goneril had poisoned

her!

At this point, Albany arrested⁽⁶⁾ Edmund for treason. He decided that Edmund must face trial by combat.(7) Edgar was the one who offered to fight Edmund and prove he was a 45 traitor. He did this still without telling anyone who he really was.

The two brothers fought, and Edgar won. Edmund fell, already close to death, and he now finally admitted(8) all his crimes.

Then Edgar finally showed who he was, and he went on to explain that their father had just died. It had happened like this. After he had found safety for the old man under a tree, he had told him he was the Earl's son. Then, asked for his father's blessing. And at that moment, the old man had suffered a huge heart attack and died. But he had at least died happily, in his son's arms.

When Goneril realised that her husband knew about Edmund and her, she became desperate, ran away and killed herself with a knife in the heart. After a messenger had returned with this shocking news, Albany 65 turned to ask the dying Edmund what he had done with Lear and Cordelia. Edmund replied that he had ordered their deaths, but if Edgar ran to the castle he might just be in time to

save them.

Edgar started to leave for the castle as fast as possible, but he was too late: Cordelia had already been killed. A moment later, Lear arrived, carrying Cordelia's dead body in his arms. This final sorrow was too great for her 75 father to bear. The old King's heart broke at

last, and he died.

In the end, only Kent, Edgar and Albany were left to bury⁽⁹⁾ the dead. Goneril's husband, the Duke of Albany, became King of England.
